The nearby Piata Romana subway station is one metro stop from Old Town, Victoria Palace, and renowned museums.

Hotel Christina 4*	Hotel Christina, in the heart of Bucharest, is a boutique hotel situated at about 5 minutes walk from the venue of Drupal HackCamp. Prices start 81.5 euros/night for a double room. You can book directly here.

Little Bucharest Hostel cheap accommodation for budget travelers	Little Bucharest has been designed especially for backpackers and young travelers, active, vibrant people who want to be part of the action-packed downtown area. Little Bucharest is within 20 minutes walking distance or 1 metro stop from the Sheraton Hotel and is located right in the Bucharest Old Town (a great location for bars & clubs). Prices start from 13 euro/day for a room with 8 beds. The hostel also features a selection of double rooms with prices starting from 22 euros/day .

Getting to Bucharest by plane	If from another country, the fastest way to get to Bucharest is by plane. Bucharest has Romania's biggest airports, the Henri Coanda International Airport (OTP). Located at 16.5 km (10.3 mi) north of Bucharest's city center, the Henri Coanda is one of the busiest airports in Romania.
	Companies from all over the world land on this airport. The airport is also base of operations for low-cost airlines Blue Air, Ryanair and Wizz Air, just as TAROM (Romania's national airline).
Blue Air	With the headquarter in Bucharest, Romania, Blue Air has been operating
	for 14 years and now offers flights to 70+ scheduled destinations in Belgium, Cyprus, France, Finland, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Norway, Portugal, Romania, Sweden, Spain, and the United Kingdom. To book your flight, check out their website https://www.blueair- web.com/en/gb/
Ryanair	If choosing Ryanair, pay attention to book your tickets for Bucharest. While it may be tempting to book a ticket for other locations in Romania such as Craiova, Oradea or Timisoara, this may end up in a more expensive and long trip to Bucharest. From Romania, the company offers flights to, and from Belgium, Cyprus, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Jordan,

Wizz Air	Just as in the case of the other low-cost companies, pay attention to book your tickets directly to Bucharest. Famous all over Europe and not only, WizzAir offers a selection of flights for an extensive list of European coun- tries, as well as non-European countries. TAROM	Tarom is the oldest currently operating airline of Romania. It is currently the second largest airline operating in Romania based on international destina- tions, international flights and the third largest measured by fleet size and passengers carried. From the airport to Drupal HackCamp	Getting from the airport to the city center is rather easy. There are three main variants on how to get to the Sheraton Hotel or to the city center. We've listed them by price from low to high.
By bus	Right after leaving the arrival area of the airport, you will see signs towards the bus station. The tickets cost around 2 euros (you will need to buy a magnetic card and the actual tickets). We recommend to take the 783 bus and to descend at "Piata Romana" (the 14th stop).
By taxi	Good news: taxis are really cheap in Romania. A taxi may be from 10 euros to 30 euros depending on the company. Still, an Uber may be the best choice, as you will pay around 5 to 10 euros.
Rent-a-car	We do not advise to rent a car, but if you want to see Bucharest's surrounding regions or other cities of Romania, this may be a good call.
