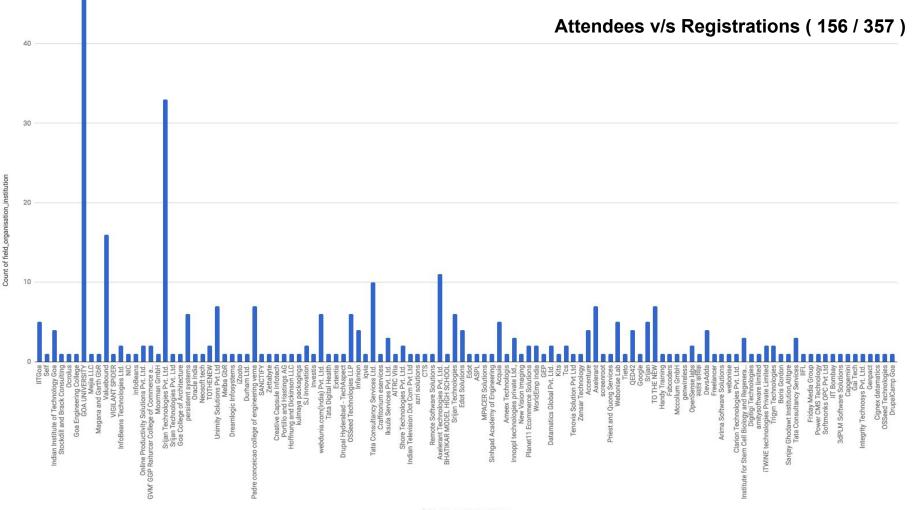

Remote Work - Pleasures and how to tackle weariness!

Prerequisite for attendees

Anyone who has worked remote and faced challenges like being less productive, getting bored etc

Session Details/Overview

With the internet making it possible for us to work from any remote corner of the world, gone are the days when one's physical presence at an office/workplace was important. Now, collaboration via online medium is the fastest and secure way to communicate with your teammates. In this session, I will be discussing about the positive vibes regarding working and collaborating with your teams remotely.

Lot of companies either startup's or even MNCs are moving towards remote working culture. Some reasons that I could think of:

- Save time in office commute: Who in the current day world does not know "traffic". A person can easily save around z hrs
 of up and down time spent in travelling. Rather, these hours can be used to be more productive in work. Also one feels
 tired due to long travel, thereby decreasing the productivity of the person.
- Save time in dressing up in formal/casual attire: An average person spends around 1 hr daily in getting ready and look best. If you work remotely it doesn't matter what you wear. You can be comfortable in whatever stuff you like. No hard rules!.
- Be more fit: Research says that sitting at same place for long time is bad for health. If you are at office it's not possible to
 get up and roam every one hour. If you work from home, you can take short breaks and relax your muscles thereby
 declining your stress levels and you turn up to be more productive and healthy.
- Eat healthy and fresh food: If you are in office you either carry your meal home cooked and have it after 4 to 5 hours or you move outside and have food from one of those roadside stalls. This can cause health issues because food is not fresh and may be prone to infections. If you work remotely you can cook and eat fresh food anytime, thereby boosting your health further.
- Flexible work time: There are some individuals who like to start work early and complete early; however it is impossible
 to make it to work as early as 5 AM. Working remotely, this is the best benefit i have felt. In case you want to work early,
 you can easily do that and on same lines if you want to have late working hours, you have the liberty to do that as well,
 just ensuring that you have some overlap with the team members. Also, with time saved from traffic and going out for
 lunch can all be used effectively to complete the tasks on time.

How to show ideal related content using NLP in Drupal?

Prerequisite for attendees

Knowledge of site building, taxonomy terms, tagging system and views. Have looked a Drupal form editor/content writer perspective.

Session Details/Overview

There are various ways to show related content in Drupal. Most of the websites rely on tagging system to show related content. This approach works fine only when you have a website with very less content or dedicated editors who know each and every tagging term, are efficient enough to figure out right tag for every content.

There might also be a situation when there isn't any common tag between the content you want to display. For eg., A person writing a blog for an e-commerce website might want to show Products related to the content of blog post, in case there aren't many products, they can be tagged manually with each and every blog post. What if there are many products and blog writer doesn't know about all of them??

A user might have reached a blog post through a search engine or social media platform. Chances of the user clicking the products link are high if it is related to the blog post.

In this session, you will learn about the following:

- 1. How NLP can be used to find important keywords in your content.
- 2. Utilisation of keywords to show related content.
- 3. Improve the way the related content of other content type is shown in Drupal.

Building Cordova app using Drupal services and ionic is one of the areas that I have been working on. This helps serve multiple use cases in the context of app development. Drupal acts as content repo and the Cordova App could consume content using the REST APIs. We use ionic because of hybrid, as well as its additional core features, faster, simple to develop and time-saving.

Google has been talking about Progressive Web Apps. These are simply web apps that give an app-like user experience to users and are built with Web Technologies and Ionic 3 is at the forefront of implementing this. Ionic 3 uses Angular which is an open source JavaScript framework to build web applications in HTML and JavaScript.

As my work in the last 1 year has been in this area with a live cross-platform solution. In this session would share some of the Key challenges and Simple solutions to make your App Cross-platform, Strategies to overcome deficiencies of ionic to build an App that is as close to a Native App.

We got one requirement that node access should work AND condition across the vocabulary in the node. So, we have analysed about how the node access is working in core for 15 days and how should we write a code to do our requirement. Finally, we have created a module at the top of the drupal node access and also this will also reduce the node_access table size. Will share about the hooks related to the nodes grants system in drupal and my experience with node access and what are all difficulties we faced when we create a custom node access.

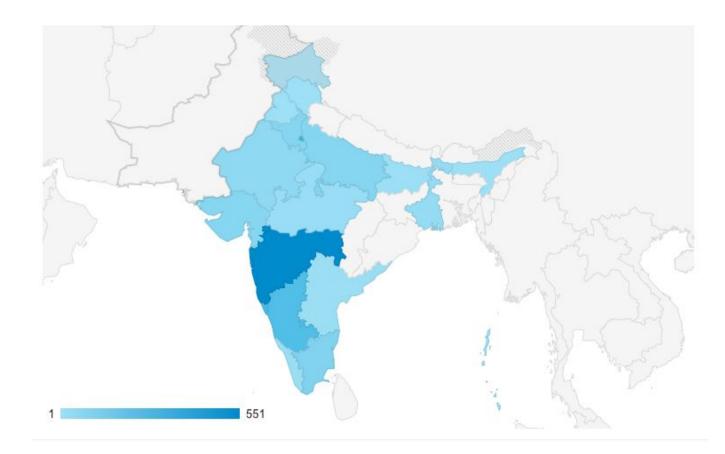
