

WFP Web Development Guidelines

On all WFP Web developments, vendors and in-house developers must provide:

- The full source code of the application with extensive in-line DocBlock documentation.
- Full SVN development history (a centralised WFP-owned SVN server should be used).
- Unit Tests covering all the functionality. Without tests, future development carries a higher risk of breaking existing behaviour and increases the overall cost of modifications due to a higher bug rate.
- User interfaces which follow usability guidelines (with special focus in ISO 9241: "Ergonomics of Human System Interaction" part 151: "Guidance on World Wide Web user interfaces" and part 17: "Form filling dialogues").
- HTML, CSS and Feeds which follow W3C Standards, passing validation of: [W3C XHTML Validator](http://validator.w3.org/)¹, [W3C CSS Validator](http://jigsaw.w3.org/css-validator/)², [W3C Feed Validator](http://validator.w3.org/feed/)³.
- Graphic design which conforms to the "WFP Branding Guidance" published by CP.
- Front-end code which follows the "[Best Practices for Speeding Up Your Web Site](http://developer.yahoo.com/performance/rules.html)"⁴, also taking into account the results of [Yslow](http://developer.yahoo.com/yslow/)⁵.
- Internal health checks for the application, compatible with standard monitoring tools.
- Data backup processes.
- Comprehensive documentation, including:
 - Low-level documentation (phpDocumentor generated documentation will suffice).
 - High-level documentation (explaining the software and hardware architecture).
 - Support documentation (to deploy, troubleshoot and debug the application & infrastructure).
 - If applicable: End-user documentation (API documentation and/or training manuals).
- If required, training of WFP staff to maintain and support the site or application in-house.
- 12-month bug warranty.

Developers must also ensure to:

- Use jQuery for JavaScript development. Additional plug-ins should only be used if they are essential. JavaScript should perform well in less powerful devices (netbooks, etc.).
- Carry out cross-browser testing, ensuring the site works well under IE7+, Chrome (all operating systems, including Android), Firefox (all operating systems), Safari (both iOS and OSX) .
- If developments are based on Drupal, the WFP.org Drupal Development Guidelines must be adhered to as well.
