Camp & venue info

- Featured speakers
 - *All keynote speakers + selected 'highlighted' speakers. Speaker info + photo. These will be displayed on the homepage in a carousel.*
- Buy tickets
 - *Registration process leading to checkout.*
- Schedule / sessions
 - *Table of schedule. Tracks & sessions. This will be linked to from the homepage, it could start off as a "propose a session link" then change to a "schedule" link when sessions are confirmed.*
- Location / transport info / venue info
 - *Any information relating to the venue, how to get there, map of the venue etc*
- About Drupal Camp London
 - *History of the camp, who's organising etc*

Community

- What to expect from a Drupal camp
 - *FAQ aimed more at people who haven't attended Drupal Camp's before but also for general info about how the camps work. E.g how the 'unconference' side of things works. Aimed to give people who feel excluded confidence to attend and prepare people.*

 - *Info about how the Drupal community works and various initiatives like camps meetups and code sprints, to inform people who don't know and to show business owners how active and dynamic the community is. Mainly London based initiatives but some larger UK & international info.*

These stories could be from the following user types: Student or person starting up in Drupal / Drupal dev who is active in the community / A stakeholder from a large organisation who chose to adopt Drupal / A freelancer who gets to travel a lot. These stories will hopefully give people an insight into the community which should satisfy some user needs such as business owners being made aware that there is an active network of freelancers, Drupal*
